Yes, You Have Homework!

The QAA educational program offers more than a collection of material to memorize and tests to pass! It offers each student the chance to become good at learning. **So, how do you become a good learner?**

- You build a daily timetable, providing at least 1 to 1.5 hours of personal work each night in Cycle 1 (Sec. 1, 2) and at least 2 to 2.5 hours each night in Cycle 2 (Sec. 3, 4, 5).
- You begin with specifically assigned work, like Math problems, English and French reading/writing, Religion journaling, Science reports, Art sketching, etc.
- Barring health or other emergencies, there should never be a student at Queen of Angels Academy who does not have her work ready on the date that it is due. Ever!
- You study for a test, or you preread material for a Social Studies discussion, etc.

- You make sure to do a five- to 10-minute review of each subject you had that day. You revisit the pages in your notebook, workbook, textbook, or handouts in order to review in your mind what was covered in class that day.
- You check your agenda to make sure that everything due the next day is done and everything needed in class is packed for transport.
- You double check your agenda to see what is coming up soon, so that it can be properly planned for and arranged.
- Each evening you check your First Class account and student (subject) conferences.
